James Nesci is Board Certified by the National College for DUI Defense and lectures nationally on DUI Defense. In addition to many Arizona seminars, Jim has lectured at several national seminars including the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, the National College for DUI Defense 2001 & 2003 Summer Trial College, the California Attorneys for Criminal Justice, the Las Vegas Bar 'Association Seminar *Killer Cross*, the *Intox 8000* Seminar, and the New York State Bar Association's 2nd and 3rd Annual *Big Apple DUI Seminars*. Jim was one of the lead attorneys on the Intoximeters RBT-IV breath-testing issue in Southern Arizona which resulted in the suppression of breath tests in over 3,000 cases and the removal of the RBT-IV from the streets of Arizona. He was lead trial attorney for Diana Ross on DUI charges in Tucson and also represented fitness guru Richard Simmons on an assault charge in Phoenix. He has taught seminars on the subjects of cross-examination, trial tactics, field sobriety testing, blood alcohol calculations, opening & closing arguments, and breath testing.

Joseph P. St. Louis is a Certified Criminal Law Specialist and has been practicing for more than 17 years. He is the president-elect for the Arizona Attorneys for Criminal Justice and the immediate past chairperson of the Arizona State Bar's Membership Assistance Committee. Joe currently serves on the State Bar's Criminal Jury Instruction Committee. In addition to his extensive experience in DUI Defense, Joe is also death-penalty qualified. Joe has taught DNA Analysis, Blood Testing, Death Penalty Jury Selection & Trial Strategy, and Victim's Rights for various organizations in Arizona and California. He is scheduled to speak at the Arizona Public Defender's Conference and the NACDL's *Making the Case for Life VIII* in Oklahoma City this year.
