He has been active in a variety of professional organizations and activities through the years and presently teaches at the University of Arizona College of Law, serves on the State Bar Professionalism Task Force and the District Court DJA Panel Selection Committee, and is a Lawyer Representative to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.
